Dear HF friends,

the 11th Nordic HF Conference HF 16 will take place Monday-Wednesday 15-17 August, 2016, with arrival on Sunday 14. HF 16 will cover VLF, LF and HF and other long-haul systems "over the horizon".

Registration will be possible in early October on www.nordichf.org. There, you may download the HF 16 First invitation and call for papers and submit your abstracts. Contributions may range from theoretical findings to practical experience.

You may register as authors, participants and/or exhibitors. The registration fee with full board, lodging and all social activities will be SEK 12,600 + VAT, unchanged since HF 10. A limited number of scholarships are available.

There is no exhibition cost if you register at least one conference participant. Students and retired seniors pay SEK 4,200. Families and weekend stays are welcome at a nominal cost.

On Sunday afternoon, August 14, HF 16 buses will take you from Visby airport (VBY) and ferry terminal to the traditional venue on Fårö, north of Gotland in the Baltic. Wednesday afternoon 17, HF 16 buses will catch afternoon flights and evening ferries; Thursday-Friday 18-19 will thus Addendum be available for meetings in Stockholm.
