Dear HF friends,

For many years, the Nordic HF meetings in Sweden have been sponsored by the Nordic Radio Society NRS, a foundation promoting radio education and research.

NRS is happy to announce HF 16, the 11th of a series since 1986, as always on the island of Fårö, north of Gotland in the Baltic Sea.

The conference will run Monday-Wednesday 15-17 August, 2016, with arrival on Sunday 14 by courtesy buses from Visby airport and the harbour ferry terminal. On Wednesday 17 the buses will catch afternoon flights and evening ferryboats to the Swedish mainland.

HF 16 will cover VLF, LF and HF systems and other long-haul communication systems "over the horizon". Papers are welcome ranging from very theoretical findings to practical experience.

Keynotes and invited talks will highlight wave propagation and forecasting, signal processing methods, antennas and radio system design in severe environments.

Plenty of exhibition areas, both indoors and outdoors, will be available for free.
